Rationale

Stichting AFNORTH International School Brunssum is a foundation under NLD Law provisions providing educational programs, which meet or exceed the national requirements of the contracting parties.

Policy

Stichting AFNORTH International School is charged with the responsibility of providing for the education of the children of nationals of the contracting parties, who are recognized by the contracting parties as entitled and for such national non-entitled children as may be permitted by National Section Heads with the concurrence of the Director. Children of other nationalities may be admitted in accordance with the rules laid down by the Board of Governors.

Definitions

- 1. Contracting Nations Canada, Germany, United Kingdom, United States
- 2. Entitled Student those students identified by the owning nations who are eligible to register without paying tuition.
- 3. Non-Entitled Student those students who are not entitled to a tuition free student position at AFNORTH International School Brunssum as defined by one of the owning nations. This includes space available and space required placements.
 - a. Non-Entitled Student Military Affiliation those students who may be enrolled on a space available, program available basis and are required to pay tuition while registered to attend AFNORTH International School.
 - b. Non-Entitled Student commercial affiliation those students who may be enrolled on a space available, program available basis, are required to pay tuition while registered to attend AFNORTH International School and must be approved by the Dutch Customs Authority.

Guidelines

- Each owning nation shall determine which students are entitled to an education within their section of AFNORTH International School.
- 2. Parents/guardians of children, who are non-entitled with a military affiliation, including students from non-owning nations stationed at local military and NATO bases and affiliates, may apply for the enrolment of their children as tuition fee paying students through the International Directorate for a position in one of the owning nations' sections, subject to meeting that country's entry regulations.
- 3. Parents/guardians of children, who are non-entitled with a commercial affiliation, including international parents working in local corporations, may apply for the enrolment of their children as tuition fee paying students through the International Directorate for a position in one of the owning nations' sections, subject to meeting the owning nation's entry regulations and approval of the Dutch Tax Authority.

- 4. Students who are admitted under 2 and 3 above are entitled to an education program offered by the school. Special education services are generally not available. English foreign language instruction is available.
- 5. Tuition fee paying middle and high school students have the choice to apply for the US Section, the German Section or for the Canadian Section.
- 6. Tuition fee paying elementary students have the choice to apply for the US Section, the German Section or for the BC-Elementary programme.
- 7. Tuition fee paying elementary students who have chosen the BC-Elementary programme will be assigned to the Canadian or British Section according a distribution formula which is put down in the Admission procedures.
- 8. Entitled students enrolled in their own national section may attend programs offered by other sections of the school on a space available basis, with the agreement of the Heads/Principals of those sections and the parents/guardians of the student. Throughout, the student remains registered with his or her own national section.
